Grape Salad

2 1/2 lbs. red and green grapes
4 oz. cream cheese softened
1/2 C. sour cream
1/4 tsp. salt
3 T packed light brown sugar
3/4 C Toasted Pecans

Cut grapes in half

Mix cream cheese, sour cream salt and 2 T brown sugar (keep other 1 T sugar for topping). Stir until sugar is dissolved. Add grapes and stir gently to coat.

Top with pecans and 1 T. brown sugar just before serving.

Spinach and Red Pepper Salad

1 package baby spinach 1 Red Pepper chopped 1/2 C parmesan cheese grated 1/4 C Olive Oil 1/4 C rice vinegar

In a large bowl mix the spinach, red pepper and parmesan. In a small bowl mix the Olive oil and rice vinegar. Toss with the Spinach mixture and serve.

- 1. Which car was first fitted with a replaceable cartridge oil filter?

5. Which car was the first to be fitted with an alternator? <u>Answers below</u>

1. The 1924 Chrysler was the first car to use a replaceable cartridge oil filter. The 1924 Chrysler was a car ahead of its time. It was designed to be an advanced car. Other advances include four wheel hydraulic brakes, another advancement still used today. The car was a huge hit selling over 900,000 units in 4 years.

2. The 1915 Scripps-Booth Model C. The car also was the first with electric door latches. The Scripps-Booth automobile company only lasted from 1913 to 1923 but this legacy is with us to this day. The Model C roadster was a luxury brand auto and was made from 1915 to 1917.

3. 1969 was the year that Cadillac introduced the first electric sunroof. Cadillac first built sun roofs into their cars in 1938. But it wasn't until the Cadillac Eldorado that the sun roof became electrically operated. It was known as the Sunshine Turret-Top-Roof.

4. The first official convertible car was the 1904 Thomas Flyer. It had a removable hard top. A 1907, Thomas Flyer won the 1908 New York to Paris Race, the first around the world automobile race ever held. 6 cars competed but only 3 ever finished. The cars crossed the Pacific using the frozen Bering Strait. The entire trip took 41 days, 8 hours, and 15 minutes.

5. The 1960 Plymouth Valiant was the first to be fitted with an alternator, rather than using a direct current dynamo. The Valiant was Plymouth's compact car and was sold in all over the world. The car was hugely successful, and *Road and Track Magazine* called it one of the best all-around domestic car.
